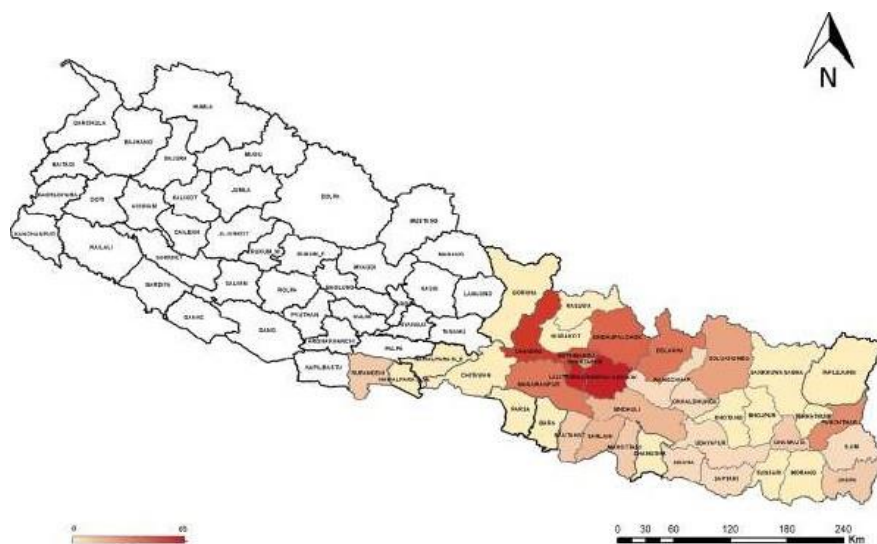


Fig: Flood and landslide affected districts by death.

1,165 persons reached with psychosocial first aid.



189 children reached with emergency services including food, clothes, and hygiene.



939 children supported with baby packs.



1,325 women and girls provided with dignity kits and kishori kits.

Population Targeted

- Children, women and senior citizens
- Persons with disability
- Persons of concern-refugee (Government approved)
- Gender and sexual minorities
- Marginalized caste/ethnic groups
- Others vulnerable groups

Key Strategies

- 1 Targeted relief assistance to most vulnerable groups
- 2 Psycho-social support including psychological first aid
- 3 Gender-based violence and child protection services
- 4 Public awareness against stigma and discrimination
- 5 Emergency assistance including legal, medical, shelter, security etc.
- 5 Inter-cluster coordination and referral for appropriate services
